How to use the
***canine daily* PREVENTATIVE POWDER**
to Reduce Odor in Smelly Dogs

- Using your hand or a gentle grooming brush, part the coat down the middle of the back and sprinkle the powder down the spine.
- Begin by working the Powder into the coat, from the top of the back and neck, down to the sides, chest, belly and legs adding more Powder to each area as it gets worked into the coat.
- For short or long haired dogs, make sure Powder is worked down to where fur meets skin, brushing out any excess from the ends.
- Reapply as needed.

How to use the
***canine daily* PREVENTATIVE POWDER**
to Reduce Itchiness and Provide Pain Relief

- Using your hands, gently pull back the fur from the red, inflamed and itchy area on your dog's coat and sprinkle on the powder. **NOTE: If skin is broken or has scabs, use the COAT DEFENSE TROUBLE SPOT DRYING PASTE** to help alleviate the skin.
- Very gently rub the powder onto the irritated skin, taking caution to not press too hard and upset your dog. The irritated area and surrounding fur should be coated with a thin layer of powder.
- Apply morning and night for the first few days to provide maximum itch relief and break the cycle of inflammation and irritation.
- Once redness begins to recede and itchiness becomes less, reduce to once a day.
- To prevent itchiness from recurring, apply a few times a week to keep your dog's skin and coat clear from yeast and bacterial buildup.

Relieve and Treat Open Hot Spots

- Gently clean any dirt or debris from treatment area. Flakey skin or scabs are ok. **DO NOT PICK OFF ANY EXISTING SCABS.**
- Using one hand, gently pull back the fur away from the hot spot, so only bare skin is exposed. Work to keep paste from getting in your dog's fur, it isn't harmful, but dries like a scab and will need washed or brushed out once it dries.
- Using your other hand, scoop paste from container with fingertips, spreading it onto affected and down to the skin. Be sure to work all the way down to skin.
- Let dry until paste has turned white.
- Leave on for several days, allowing Paste to work it's magic. It is best to let the Paste fall off on it's own, carrying away yeast and bacteria with it as it does!
- Check affected area, if any scabs or open sores remain, reapply as needed. If they have mended and started to fade, switch to applying the Canine daily Preventative Powder to help prevent hot spots from returning.

to Aid in Wound Healing

- Gently clean any dirt or debris from the wound, flakey skin or scabs are ok. **DO NOT PICK OFF ANY EXISTING SCABS.**
- Using one hand, gently pull back the fur away from the wound, so only bare skin is exposed. Work to keep paste from getting in your dog's fur, it isn't harmful, but dries like a scab and will need washed or brushed out once it dries.
- Using your other hand, scoop paste from container with fingertips, spreading it onto affected and down to the skin. Be sure to work all the way down to skin.
- Let dry until paste has turned white.
- Leave on for several days, allowing Paste to work it's magic. It is best to let the Paste fall off on it's own, carrying away yeast and bacteria with it as it does!
- Check affected area, if any scabs or open sores remain, reapply as needed. If they have mended and started to fade, switch to applying the canine daily Preventative Powder to help prevent yeast and bacterial build up around wound.
